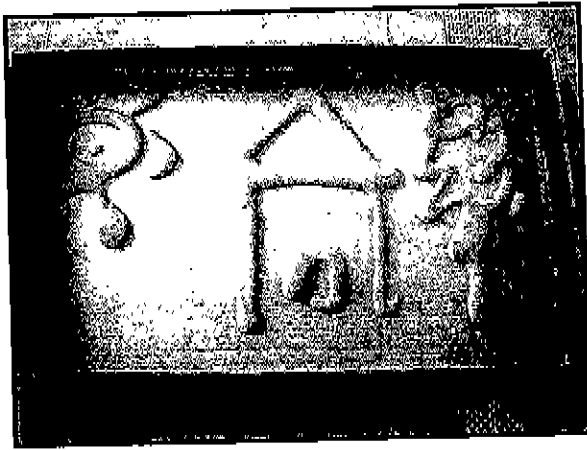


## Puffy Paint



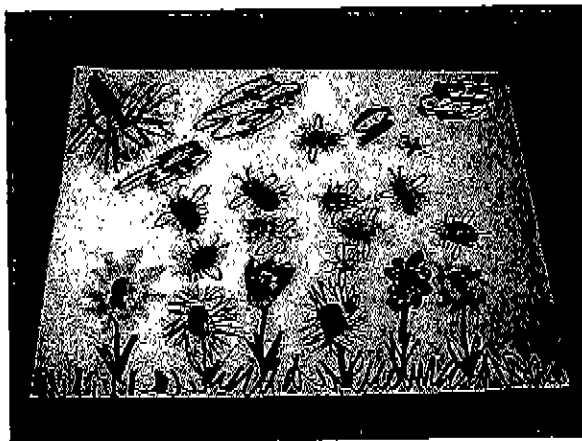
### Puffy Paint

#### Materials:

- Flour
- Salt
- Food coloring
- Squeeze bottles such as those used for catsup and mustard
- Cardboard paper plate
- Bowl
- Spoon

Directions: Mix equal parts flour, salt and water with food coloring. Use empty tempera paint bottles to squirt "paint" on cardboard paper plate. Encourage children to make small blobs of colors around the paper. It takes a long time to dry, but when it does it dries hard with shiny crystals and it's very beautiful.

## Thumb Print Insects



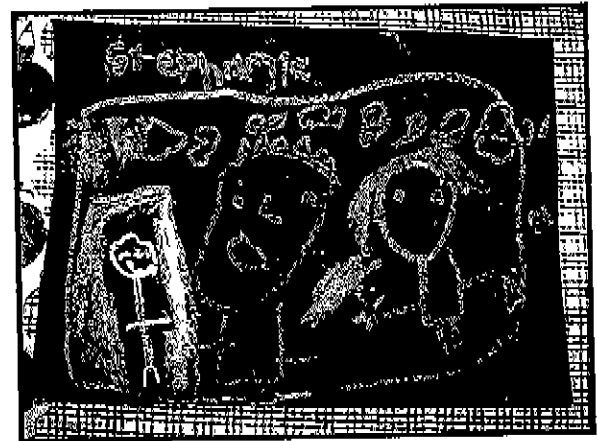
### Thumb Print Insects

#### Materials:

- Stamp pads in a variety of colors
- Markers
- Paper

Directions: Press thumb onto ink pad and then onto paper. Add antennae, legs, wings, eyes, etc to make different kinds of bugs. Make lots of them all over the paper.

## Wet Chalk Drawing



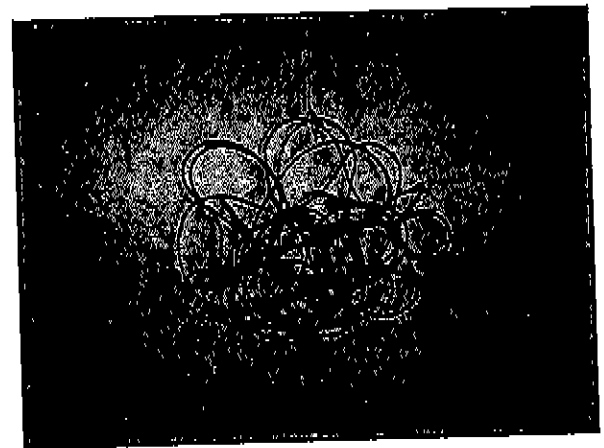
### Wet Chalk Drawings

#### Materials:

- Chalk
- Water or milk
- Paper
- Cup or bowl

Directions: Dip the chalk in milk or water and draw on paper. The milk will give the chalk a thicker texture. Talk to the children about how the chalk feels.

## Sugar Water Mobiles



### Sugar Water Mobiles

#### Materials:

- Sugar
- Water
- String cut into 8-12" lengths
- Bowl
- Spoon
- Wax paper

Directions: Mix 2 cups of sugar with 1 cup of warm water. Let stand until sugar is completely dissolved. Dip the string in the sugar mixture. Use the spoon to push it in the liquid. Arrange pieces of string on wax paper to create a design. Let dry. The sugar will create a frosted effect. While drying a layer of sugar can be sprinkled on the design. They can be hung in the window or used as mobiles.
